- Participated in boycotts, marches, and lunch counter sit-ins in his native Nashville and elsewhere

As a Detroit Public School Teacher, Mr. Hardy worked to keep the spirit of the movement alive in his students, and his work with the Detroit Historical Society has highlighted the Freedom Rides and the 1967 Rebellion in Detroit.
