SOCIOENVIRONMENTAL POLICY

A LZ Grãos is a company committed to the responsible development of its business, providing a favorable environment that encourages good socioenvironmental practices throughout its value chain. Its **Socioenvironmental Policy** establishes guidelines that are the foundation for these good practices, and its **Grain Sustainability Policy** is one of its commitments that aims to engage all stakeholders in the production chain, with the aim of minimizing environmental impacts and, at the same time, conform to human rights and respect local communities.

Its activities are based on the following guidelines:

Meet legal requirements and established institutional commitments.

Mitigate environmental pollution by optimizing the use of natural resources and establishing the necessary controls to avoid or minimize socio-environmental impacts.

Ensure continuous improvement in its activities and services, always seeking to evaluate the effectiveness of its social and environmental management system.

Conduct training and socio-environmental awareness among its employees and those acting on behalf of the company.

Promote respect for human rights and decent work in its operations and supply chain.

GRAIN SUSTAINABILITY POLICY

General Commitments

ALZ Grãos is committed to collaborating with all stakeholders in the value chain to:

- **Eliminate deforestation along its entire production chain** and conserve biomes of high ecological value, such as the Amazon and the Cerrado, with the intention of discouraging and eliminating the conversion of native vegetation to alternative land use in Brazil.
- **Respect the rights** of local communities.
- **Respect the fundamental conventions** of the International Labor Organization (ILO).
- **Protect conservation areas** and their existing biodiversity.
- **Build sound relationships**, with full respect for applicable anti-corruption laws and property rights.

In addition, **ALZ Grãos is committed to:**



Conducting socioenvironmental impact assessments for the development of new infrastructure and logistics.



Ensuring that grain supply is absolutely consistent with the Forestry Code and related Brazilian regulations and slavery work.



Ensuring that the supply comes exclusively from producers who comply with the Brazilian Rural Environmental Registry (CAR), through contractual compliance and documented evidence, in accordance with all legal requirements.

These principles apply to all business transactions and business relationships.

Based on its **efforts for responsible development in Brazil**, ALZ Grãos will fulfill **existing and arising commitments** from its partner companies and will support their actions in the following initiatives:

Engage producers, the Cerrado Biome Working Group and other stakeholders to eliminate the conversion of native vegetation for alternative land use in the Cerrado Biome.

Fulfill the Soy Moratorium, which was established prior to Congressional approval of the current Forestry Code, and which refers to the voluntary ban on the purchase of soy produced on deforested land in the Amazon Biome after 2008.

Engage in working groups that strive to promote sustainable development, including:

- Tool involving various audiences used to identify areas of sustainable expansion.
- Initiatives to promote agriculture and sustainable procurement, such as Soy Plus and the European Feed Manufacturers Federation (FEFAC) Soy Sourcing Guidelines.

Work and track groups from different audiences, such as ABIOVE, in setting standards and implementing mechanisms to protect areas of critical importance for biodiversity, carbon and water.
