Shortly after returning to the DR in January, we learned that Eddie, a local plumber/electrician often employed at our mission sites, fell from a roof and broke both of his legs. With no health insurance, and out of work for at least two months of recovery, but still needing to support his family, this accident came as a real tragedy for Eddie.

Eddie's misfortune has given the people of our mission churches a chance to show God's love to him and his family. Many have prayed for him, visited him, given gifts of food, and even dipped into their own meager resources to help with medical bills. More than that, these same people who feel moved to use their hands and feet in service to their neighbor have made it obvious that the source of their love for Eddie comes from God, who first loved them through the gift of salvation in Jesus Christ.

The month of January has been a difficult one for our missionary families in Latin America as well, with a lot of illness; some car accidents; robbery; losses of power or water; and concern for the safety of pastors and relatives in troubled places such as Venezuela. During such times we cry out to God, knowing that our help comes from Him (Psalm 121). We are also comforted by the knowledge that YOU are praying for us and the people whom we serve. **THANK YOU!**

Kelly Schumacher, founder of Agnus Dei Liturgical Arts (http://agnusdeiarts.com/) is serving as a short-term missionary artist in the DR during the month of January. Collaborating with Deaconess Cheryl and the Mercy Center, Kelly taught several art classes at Concordia Lutheran School in Palmar Arriba, provided special classes for missionary children, and lectured on how art can be used in proclamation of the Gospel, using many of her own pieces as examples.

While in the DR, Kelly is also painting a picture which will hang in the main conference room of the Mercy Center. Kelly was commissioned to paint this picture - underwritten by the Mary Martha Guild of Trinity Lutheran Church, Scarsdale, NY - in loving memory of Edith DeCecca, a member of that congregation who loved religious art.

The models for the painting are children from Concordia Lutheran School, from Good Shepherd Lutheran Home, and last but not least, Odalis (who works in the local hardware store) served as the model for Jesus!
