



**1916 Bursary** 

€5000 per year of undergraduate study at a MEND region institution: Athlone Institute of Technology (AIT), Dublin City University (DCU), Dundalk Institute of Technology (DkIT) and Maynooth University (MU)

The 1916 Bursary Fund is a targeted funding scheme established by the Department of Education and Skills to support the implementation of the National Plan for Equity of Access to Higher Education 2015-2019. The National Access Plan is working to increase the numbers of students who are currently under-represented in higher education.

10 Bursaries are offered to undergraduate students experiencing socio-economic disadvantage who are commencing third level education at Maynooth in September 2020 for the first time - and will fund the entire duration of a student's programme of study.

## YOU MAY BE ELIGIBLE TO APPLY FOR THE 1916 BURSARY

If:

- Your household reckonable income does not exceed €24,500 for 2019
- You belong to one of the 1916 Bursary Fund target groups (i.e. Lone Parents, Irish Travellers, Person experiencing Homelessness, Person with a Disability, Member of an Ethnic Minority, in/were in Care of the State)
- You are a first-time applicant to a full or part-time undergraduate (including mature students and Further Education Award Holders)

## APPLICATIONS ARE OPEN 30 JUNE 2020 - 30 OCTOBER 2020 AT 4PM
