# ACTION

1 Arrange a swab for SARS-CoV-2 PCR. If...

#### **PCR** Positive

Manage according to current COVID-19 guidelines and review after 2 weeks hospital admission not required.

### PCR Negative

Ask patient to self-isolate for 14 days and then review symptoms
